Program Notes:

Lately, it seems that every third piece I compose feels like pulling teeth. For reasons that (mostly) have nothing to do with the work itself, *Movements* (for Clarinet and Live Electronics) is one of those pieces. Whatever dramas unfolded between April and May, here is some dry information about the piece.

Movements consists of four short moments. The first three are fully notated; the fourth is improvisatory. Each movement was constructed using a pitch-class set derived from the name "Jacob Wolf", the performer for whom this piece was composed. The Bach library for Max/MSP was used to create sketches that then underwent "composition surgery" in Sibelius. The final score is displayed in Max, synced with the live signal processing.


Technical Notes:

To perform this piece the player needs:


- 1. A computer
- 2. A stereo USB audio interface (microphone in input 1, stereo outs)
- 3. A microphone (in input 1 of the interface)
- 4. A MIDI foot pedal programmed to output note 64 (for changing cues spacebar also works if absolutely necessary)
- 5. Max/MSP (available here: https://cycling74.com/downloads)


Upon opening the patch, a "landing screen" is displayed that provides further information about operating the patch (see the screenshot on the next page).

Note that this is a practice score only. The player reads the score from the patch during performance. Descriptions about the audio processing at each cue are displayed in the patch.




